LIGHTS IN A FAT CITY were a British band that had a brief career fusing the aboriginal digeridoo to the high-tech world of allicon trance-dance music. Their 1988 album Somewhere was barely available anywhere, and was lost in the shuffle created by fellow digeritosers Outback. Now, a new label, City Of Tribes (63 Fountain St., San Francisco CA 94114) has reissued that album, and is working on a new release by former Fai City member Stephen Kent and TRANCE MISSION, This San Francisco-based band, which includes members of New York Ensemble For Early Music, Blue Rubies and Club Foot Orchestra, explores both the modern potential and ancient ritual of the music of Australia, through the digeridoo, phenomenal percussion, woodwinds and silicon devices. It is enchanting, but it also screams, using the power as well as the grace of the drone instruments to bring together jazz, folk and primardial dance, and make remarkably nanest, row techno-tribal music.
